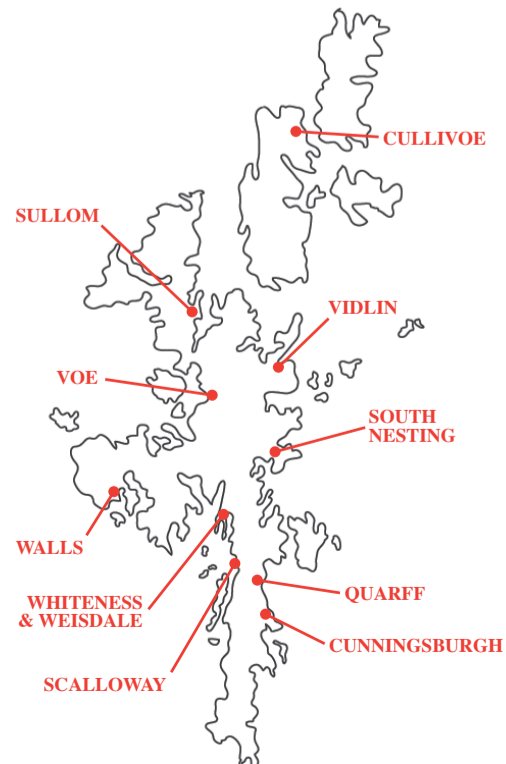

VISITING ARTISTES

Iain MacPhail Scottish Dance Band. One of the best known and respected bands in the Scottish Dance Music scene. Iain has made numerous visits to Shetland both on his own and with the band

Wayne Robertson Scottish Dance Band. Wayne and his Scottish Dance Band are highly regarded in Scotland and beyond. The band offers a highly diverse repertoire suitable for concerts, dances and reel parties.

Graeme Mitchell Scottish Dance Band. The band was formed in 1982 and, apart from Graeme, two members, Brian Cruickshank and Gordon Duguid are still in the band today. Graeme and the band played at the first festival in 1988

Craig McCallum Scottish Dance Band. A very young Craig and the band played at the first festival in 1988 and at the Town Hall for Lerwick's Up Helly Aa Festival for many years. There is a strong Shetland connection as Craig's wife, Hazel, hails from Scalloway.

Tom Orr Band. Tom is one of the brightest and leading exponents of Scottish Dance band music bringing a youthful approach to our music. The Band creates a lively, innovative, unique style.

Neil MacEachern Scottish Dance Band. Neil formed his band in 1987 after playing with many other bands. The band has done many broadcasts and commercial recordings in its distinctive west coast style

The Pentlands Ceilidh Band. The band has been playing at concerts and ceilidhs all over Scotland as well as many Up Helly Aa nights for over 25 years. The line up now is Derek Rae, Colin Brown and Gary Kellow playing piano accordion, 5 row accordion and drums.

The David Kennedy Trio. This young trio of David Kennedy (accordion), Maggie Adamson (fiddle) & Steven Todd (piano) are playing at the festival for the first time although they are no strangers to the event.

The Jim Gold Trio. The band consisting of Jim Gold, Tom Gold and Ross Anderson was formed in 2005 and now play for ceilidhs and weddings all over Scotland. This will their fourth visit to the Shetland Festival

The Richard Ross Trio. Well known as lead accordionist with the West Telferton Band Richard is joined by Jim Nichol on piano and Ian Adamson on drums for this visit to Shetland

The Niall Kirkpatrick Trio. Niall, who lives in Islay has attended previous festivals with his own band. This time he is accompanied by John Burns and Alan Sutherland, both well known in Shetland.

Gavin Piper & Callum Wallace. Gavin plays a variety of music including ceilidh, trad, modern, classical and continental. Callum, who also plays guitar and sings will accompany Gavin on drums.

Jimmy Cassidy & Jim Cleland. Jimmy was senior Scottish accordion champion at the age of 15 and has played with the likes of Lex Mclean and Andy Stewart. He is joined by Jim Cleland who played with Jim MacLeod for over 30 years.

Graeme Mackay. Son of Band leader Jim Mackay. He has been resident accordion player at the Cairngorm Hotel in Aviemore for the past three years and has recently taken up teaching the button box

The Gibb Brothers. Andrew and Adam Gibb were pupils of Keith Dickson and have since performed throughout the Scottish music scene with various bands and have taken part in several "Take the Floor" broadcasts

Ewen Rorie & Andrew Dennison. One of Orkney's top fiddle players Ewen is making his first appearance at a Shetland Festival accompanied on piano by Andrew Dennison

Paul Anderson. Already something of a legend in the time honoured fiddle tradition of Scotland, Paul is one of the finest Scots fiddlers of

his generation. He has attended the Shetland Festival on many occasions.

Claire Gullan & Martainn Skene. Claire originally from Banchory was taught by Jane Davidson and has competed in many competitions including Glenfiddich. She is accompanied on piano by Martainn Skene

John Daly. No stranger to Shetland festivals John is one of Ireland's top fiddle players and now lives in Co. Tipperary. He is accompanied by Patrick O'Loughlin, one of Ireland's finest young accordion players

Tom Byrne & Michael Gallanagh. Tom plays button accordion and chromatic and diatonic harmonica. Michael is regarded as one of the most innovative guitarists in the traditional music scene in Ireland

Manus McGuire & Emily Flack. Born in Co. Sligo but living in Co. Clare Manus is no stranger to the Shetland Festival and performed the opening ceremony some years ago. He is joined on this visit by Emily Flack from Ontario.

George Davidson. From Tarves in Aberdeenshire this is George's first time to Shetland. He has won many competitions over the years including the last ever Glenfiddich Fiddle Championship in 2015

Alan Clark. Well known to Shetland festival audiences as the "sound man" in the club for many years Alan makes a welcome return this year as a visiting artiste. A former Scottish Accordion Champion Alan also taught many pupils the accordion while he lived in Shetland.

Jan Arild's Orchestra. From Mid Norway, making their first visit to the Shetland Festival the group consisting of 3 accordions, fiddle, guitar and bass play Norwegian traditional music
